DAY 1 – MONDAY

JOHANNESBURG

Spend a full day exploring **Soweto** and surrounds. The tour starts with a visit to the prestigious **Apartheid Museum**, located in Johannesburg's Ormondo suburb. The museum covers the full history of the Apartheid era in South Africa. From here you will continue to Soweto for a tour through this vibrant township. You will visit the **Hector Peterson Memorial** that commemorates the role of the country's students in the struggle against Apartheid. Continue to the **Liliesleaf Heritage Site** for a tour. Once known as Liliesleaf Farm this fascinating heritage site is closely linked to the Rivonia Treason Trial that led to Nelson Mandela's incarceration. In the early 1960's Liliesleaf was a sanctuary where most prominent leaders of South Africa's struggle against Apartheid sought shelter, attended secret meetings and engaged in key debates on political and military policy and strategy. You will learn in great detail what happened during those days and the ultimate arrest of Nelson Mandela.

Return to your hotel for overnight.

DAY 2 – TUESDAY

JOHANNESBURG - KRUGER NATIONAL PARK

This morning you will be transferred to OR Tambo International Airport for your onward flight to Mpumalanga (unescorted). On arrival you will be met by our representative and transferred to your lodge. After freshening up, enter the world famous **Kruger National Park** and spend the afternoon **game viewing** in your closed touring vehicle. The park offers some of the best game viewing and wildlife opportunities in the world – and the visitor will soon appreciate the challenges of managing this unique reserve. Return to the lodge for dinner and overnight. [Breakfast & Dinner]

DAY 3 – WEDNESDAY

KRUGER NATIONAL PARK

The day begins with early morning coffee or tea, followed by a thrilling **open vehicle game drive** (with English speaking game ranger) through **Kruger National Park** with pre-packed breakfast. Your guide will endeavour to spoil you with sightings of the "Big Five", general game and prolific bird life. Return to the lodge for lunch (own account) and a short siesta. In the afternoon we will journey once again through the magnificent expanses of the Kruger National Park, unrivalled in its diversity of flora and fauna. Enjoy an afternoon of game viewing in your closed touring vehicle pursuing the Big Five and other rare and endangered species. Optional (own account) open vehicle game drives are available.

Return to the lodge for dinner and overnight. [Breakfast & Dinner]

DAY 4 – THURSDAY

MPUMALANGA

Enjoy breakfast before setting out to explore the magnificent **Panorama Route**, one of the most scenic routes in the region, offering glorious views, spectacular landscapes and exquisite waterfalls. Visit majestic sights including **God's Window**, the **Three Rondawels** and **Blyderiver Canyon** – the third largest canyon of its kind in the world, **Bourke's Luck Potholes** and the charming village of **Graskop**, one of the first gold mining camps in the country. Optional (own account) open vehicle game drives are available, should you prefer not to join the Panorama Route tour.

Return to the lodge for dinner and overnight. [Breakfast & Dinner]

DAY 5 – FRIDAY

MPUMALANGA – CAPE TOWN

Enjoy breakfast before transferring to Kruger Mpumalanga International Airport for your onward flight to Cape Town (unescorted). On arrival in **Cape Town**, the oldest city in South Africa, spectacularly set at the foot of Table Mountain, you'll be met and transferred to your hotel, where the remainder of the day is yours to relax or explore the city (unescorted). [Breakfast]

DAY 6 – SATURDAY

CAPE TOWN

Continue your journey of discovery, by joining a morning **Cape Town city tour**. Our drive through the city centre takes us past famous landmarks such as the **Castle of Good Hope** built in 1666 by the Dutch East India Company, **City Hall**, a baroque building

and the **Grand Parade**. As we follow the city's main thoroughfare, Adderley Street, we will see **St. George's Cathedral**, the Anglican Diocese of Nobel Peace Laureate Archbishop Desmond Tutu. We will pass the **Company Gardens** and the **Malay Quarter** [also known as the Bo-Kaap] which means "Above Cape" because of its location up against the slopes of Table Mountain. Our route then leads us to Kloof Nek and the magnificent **Table Mountain**. We'll ascend to the top [weather permitting & cable way ticket for own account] by the revolving cable car. On a clear day it is even possible to see Robben Island where Nelson Mandela was imprisoned on one side and Cape Point on the other. Descend from the Upper Cableway station to your awaiting vehicle and then proceed around Table Bay to the Milnerton area (time permitting). From here we can see Table Mountain from the same perspective as the early settlers did when they sailed into Table Bay. The remainder of the afternoon will be at leisure for you to relax or further explore the surrounds.

Overnight in Cape Town. [Breakfast]

DAY 7 – SUNDAY

CAPE TOWN

After a relaxing breakfast, you'll have a **full day at leisure**. Why not join an optional tour of the Cape Peninsula (own account). Drive through Sea Point, the seaside village of Hout Bay and then to Cape Point where (by tradition) it is said that the Atlantic and Indian Oceans meet. Return to Cape Town through the historic naval base of Simon's Town and Muizenberg to visit Kirstenbosch Botanical Gardens, a centre for the preservation of the region's unique flora.

Overnight in Cape Town. [Breakfast]

DAY 8 – MONDAY

CAPE TOWN

Enjoy some last minute shopping (unescorted) or sightseeing (own account). Wander through the variety of shops and boutiques catering for all tastes and budgets at the V&A Waterfront. Later you will be transferred to the airport, harbour or railway station for your onward journey. [Breakfast]
